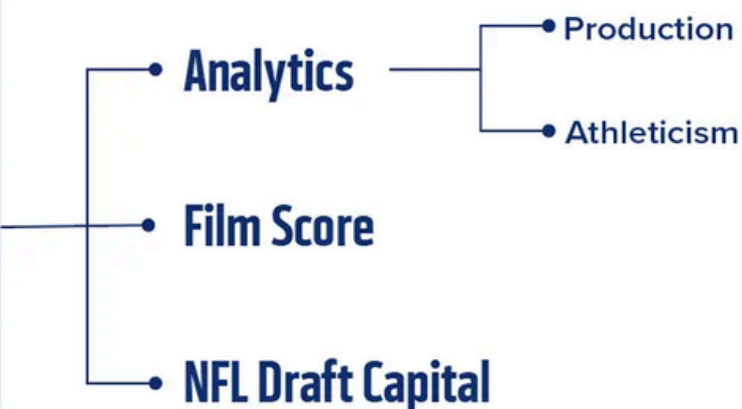

SLEEPERS



Adam Randall, RB, Baltimore Ravens

Randall lasted until Round 5, but the landing spot is promising in Baltimore. He'll compete with Justice Hill for the No. 2 RB role, and beat writer Jeff Zrebiec has mentioned Hill as a potential cut candidate. Baltimore also rosters third-year back Rasheen Ali, but he has just 17 career carries and no ties to the new coaching staff. The big question is how long Derrick Henry remains effective. The 32-year-old is signed for two more seasons but surpassed 3,000 career touches last year. At 6'3, 232 pounds, Randall brings Henry-like size. He also converted from WR just two years ago, so there's potential for him to develop and earn touches over time.

Derrick Henry is 32, and his efficiency showed signs of decline last season, with drops in yards per carry, yards after contact, breakaway rate, and Pro Football Focus elusive rating. Randall brings similar size (6'3, 232 pounds) but adds a receiving element as a former WR. Baltimore also lacks proven depth behind Henry, with Justice Hill averaging just 1.8 carries per game last season and Rasheen Ali seeing only seven total attempts. Randall could work his way into the rotation this summer and looks like a strong in the fourth round of rookie drafts.

SLEEPERS



Demond Claiborne, RB, Minnesota Vikings

There isn't much to like about this RB class, but Claiborne has the talent and situation to outplay his Round 6 draft capital. He entered 2025 as a potential top-100 selection, but injuries to his rib, arm, and knee led to mediocre film this past season. Even so, he finished 179-907-10 on the ground and 28-140-0 through the air. His 4.3 speed shows up on film, and he plays bigger than his 188-pound frame. The Vikings help, too. Claiborne can beat out Xavier Scott for the No. 3 RB spot, and only Aaron Jones and Jordan Mason stand ahead of him. Both are free agents after this season, and Jones' injury history could get Claiborne on the field early despite his late draft capital. Round 6 backs usually need a miracle. Claiborne might just need one opening on this depth chart.

Justin Joly, TE, Denver Broncos

In a putrid RB class and just-decent (possibly overrated) WR class, I'm drawn to the TEs in the later rounds of rookie drafts. Oscap Delp, Eli Raridon, and Tanner Koziol are intriguing targets. But Joly looks like the best value. The argument against him is that he fell to Round 5. But he landed in a nice spot with HC Sean Payton. And all that's standing between Joly and the top of the depth chart is 31-year-old Evan Engram, who's set to become a free agent next offseason. Joly is coming off a productive college career, breaking out at 18 at UConn, leading North Carolina State in receiving yards in 2024 (ahead of KC Concepcion), and leading N.C. State in receiving TDs last year. Joly turns just 22 in July and could be Denver's top pass-catching TE by 2027.

Tanner Koziol, TE, Jacksonville Jaguars

Lemme start with this: I'm struggling to see sleepers in this class to the degree of previous years. I won't be chasing anyone in later rounds. That said, the NFL Draft might have helped our chances of getting this guy.

Koziol got plenty of DS love behind the scenes as we prepped for draft weekend. He posted huge receiving numbers the past two seasons and racked up 237 catches for his college career. Then he backed the production with good athletic testing at the Combine, especially for a guy who stands 6'6.

Of course, he then lingered on the board into Round 5, going three rounds later than the first TE Jacksonville selected, Nate Boerkircher. Perhaps that Texas A&M alum proves to be a worthwhile all-around TE and limits Koziol's role for the life of their rookie contracts. But maybe Borkircher's the blocker to Koziol's receiver and there's room for both after Brenton Strange's contract expires in March.

Koziol's lackluster draft capital should keep him in Round 4 of rookie drafts -- or maybe even Round 5. I'll buy the receiving upside anywhere in that range of this nauseating class.

Jordyn Tyson, WR, New Orleans Saints

As the resident film guy, I can't get on board with Tyson as a top-10 NFL Draft pick. His highlights are amazing, but his lowlights are by far the worst among the top WRs in the class. From lazy route running to straight-up falling down after the catch, he puts too many bad plays on tape that won't fly in the NFL. The film issues are enough on their own, but Tyson also has never finished a college season. Over the last four years, a multi-ligament knee tear, broken collarbone, and hamstring strains have all cut his seasons short. None of those individual injuries means he can't stay healthy in the NFL. But the injury risk, combined with the film red flags, will keep me away from Tyson in rookie drafts.

Omar Cooper Jr., WR, New York Jets

I've been skeptical of Cooper all along. He didn't break out until he was a 21-year-old senior. And even in that 2025 campaign, he averaged fewer receiving yards per game than fourth-rounder Elijah Sarratt. Landing with the Jets doesn't have me any more optimistic about Cooper's dynasty outlook. The Jets don't have their long-term answer at QB, but they do have a target hog in Garrett Wilson that caps Cooper's ceiling. Plus, they spent the 16th pick of the draft on TE Kenyon Sadiq, who operates in the same middle area of the field as Cooper. There are simply too many question marks here for a guy who will go in the top 10 of most rookie drafts.

De’Zhaun Stribling, WR, San Francisco 49ers

Going with the first pick of Round 2 will push Stribling up rookie draft boards. He has good size (6'2, 210 pounds) and 4.36 speed, but he struggles to separate and was below average in contested-catch situations. HC Kyle Shanahan praised his downfield blocking and views him as a potential Juan Jennings replacement, but Jennings took time to develop. Stribling could follow a similar slow path, making him a potential overdraft. He's more likely to provide real-life value early than consistent fantasy production. That makes him a better target if he slips in rookie drafts than a player to reach for.

Stribling checks the size and athleticism boxes at 6'2, 207 pounds with a 9.57 Relative Athletic Score. But the profile still leans more athlete than football player. Our [Shark Rookie Model](#) ranks him 17th in film grade and 21st in college production, and he'll turn 24 during his rookie season. The landing spot offers some long-term appeal with Mike Evans and George Kittle getting old, but Stribling doesn't give me much confidence that he'll capitalize.

Kenyon Sadiq, TE, New York Jets

The value in this class dies so quickly that I think we really need to look high for true bust candidates. And I've been wary of Sadiq all along.

Let's start with the size-athleticism profile. You'll find Sadiq's list of Mockdraftable comps littered with previous mid-to-late-round TEs who promised receiving upside and didn't deliver. And you might also notice that the comps don't feature particularly close matches.

Most players feature multiple comps in the 80+% range. Sadiq sports only one at greater than 70%, and that's classmate Eli Stowers at 79.7%. (We'll get back to him in a minute.)

You could point to that lack of matching profiles as evidence that Sadiq's different in a good way. I'd counter by asking why that didn't produce bigger college numbers.

He caught just 29 passes through two seasons before an apparent 2025 breakout. Sadiq led his final Oregon team in receptions, but five teammates caught 26+ passes and averaged more yards per catch than he did. If he's so different, then how come Oregon couldn't take advantage?

Player Overview

Mendoza flashed NFL potential at Cal but reached another level after transferring to Indiana in 2025. He won the Heisman and a national championship, throwing for 3,535 yards with 41 TDs and 6 INTs, and adding 276 rushing yards and 7 TDs.

Accuracy headlines his skill set. He anticipates coverage and throws receivers open, making him dangerous against any defense. Above-average pocket movement and footwork support his franchise QB upside.

Mendoza's arm strength does not match recent top prospects such as Caleb Williams, but toughness and situation make him a top-2 rookie pick in superflex drafts. He might open his career backing up Kirk Cousins, but it's not a concern for his long-term value.

Player Overview

Simpson finally started for Alabama in 2025 after sitting behind Jalen Milroe for two seasons. The results were mixed.

Simpson has only 15 college starts. First-round QBs with 15 or fewer starts over the past 10 years include:

- Anthony Richardson
- Mitchell Trubisky
- Dwayne Haskins

That's concerning. Simpson did flash NFL-caliber traits while throwing for 3,567 yards, 28 TDs, and 5 INTs. His father has coached Tennessee-Martin for 20 years.

Being the 13th overall pick bodes well for Simpson's future. Sitting behind Matthew Stafford and developing slowly may be best for Simpson's long-term outlook.

Player Overview

Allar looks the part: 6'5, 228 pounds with the arm to make every throw. He's even a plus runner, averaging a shade over 22 yards per game for his college career.

But Allar leaves Penn State as a relative disappointment. He tossed 25 TDs vs. 2 INTs in his starting debut as a sophomore and then jumped to 8.4 yards per attempt as a junior. But he plummeted to 6.9 yards per attempt with just 8 TDs vs. 3 INTs in six appearances last year. His season ended in October with a broken left ankle.

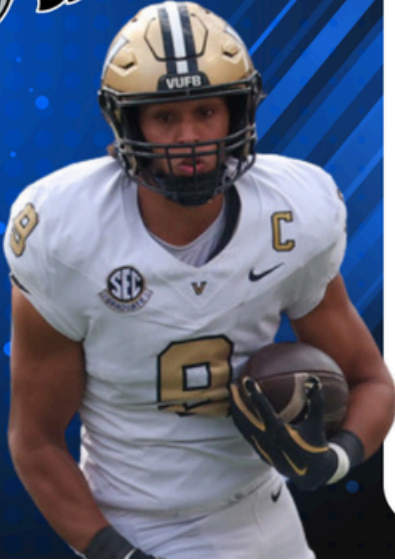
