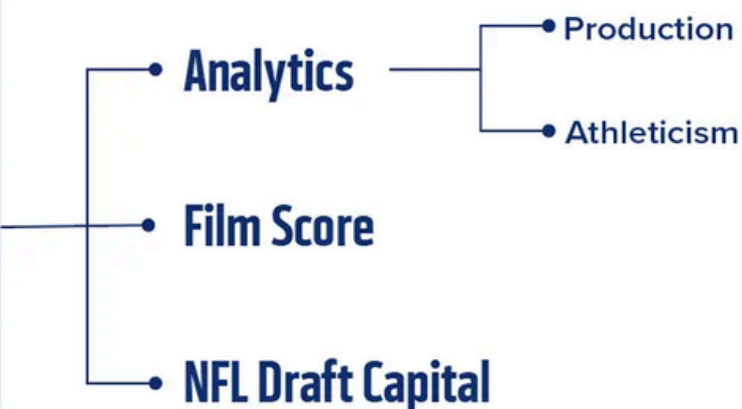

Player Overview

Mendoza flashed NFL potential at Cal but reached another level after transferring to Indiana in 2025. He won the Heisman and a national championship, throwing for 3,535 yards with 41 TDs and 6 INTs, and adding 276 rushing yards and 7 TDs.

Accuracy headlines his skill set. He anticipates coverage and throws receivers open, making him dangerous against any defense. Above-average pocket movement and footwork support his franchise QB upside.

Mendoza's arm strength does not match recent top prospects such as Caleb Williams, but toughness and situation make him a top-2 rookie pick in superflex drafts. He might open his career backing up Kirk Cousins in Las Vegas, but it's not a concern for his long-term value.

Player Overview

Simpson finally started for Alabama in 2025 after sitting behind Jalen Milroe for two seasons. The results were mixed.

Simpson has only 15 college starts. First-round QBs with 15 or fewer starts over the past 10 years include:

- Anthony Richardson
- Mitchell Trubisky
- Dwayne Haskins

That's concerning. Simpson did flash NFL-caliber traits while throwing for 3,567 yards, 28 TDs, and 5 INTs. His father has coached Tennessee-Martin for 20 years.

Simpson shows first-round mechanics, a smooth delivery, and class-best footwork. But average arm strength and limited experience hurt his early upside.

Player Overview

Love enters the draft as the most complete RB prospect in this class.

He compiled 2,497 rushing yards and 35 TDs over the past two seasons, displaying an elite combination of burst, contact balance, and long speed.

Love's final season confirmed he could handle more responsibility without sacrificing efficiency. He ranked near the top of the nation in yards per carry, yards after contact, and breakaway runs while also contributing meaningfully as a receiver (27 catches for 280 yards).

Love is our 1.01 in both 1-QB and superflex rookie drafts. His projected top-10 NFL Draft capital makes him an immediate candidate for RB1 production.

Player Overview

Price never handled a feature workload while playing with Jeremiyah Love. But he squeezed maximum value out of limited touches over the past two seasons.

After rebounding from a ruptured Achilles in 2022, he showed consistent burst, power, and efficiency. That produced 6.0 career yards per carry and 10.8 per catch (albeit on only 15 career receptions).

The Athletic's Dane Brugler went so far as to say Price may have generated Heisman buzz had he transferred out of Notre Dame in 2025. Instead, Price hits the NFL with limited wear on his body.

We'll see about the landing spot, but Price is widely expected to come off the board in Round 2.

Player Overview

Coleman's dynasty appeal isn't tied to one spike season. It's rooted in three years of steady production, physical running, and usable pass-game skills.

He carved out a role early at Arizona before following HC Jedd Fisch to Washington and immediately claiming the No. 1 job. Coleman handled nearly two-thirds of the team's carries in 2024. And that workload came with elite contact balance and strong yards-after-contact numbers -- despite poor run blocking.

A knee injury impacted his final season, but Coleman still finished with career highs in receptions and yards per route.

With a 220-pound frame and experience in a pro-style system, Coleman projects as a Day 2 pick who can contribute early.

Player Overview

Washington spent three seasons at Buffalo before making one-year stops at New Mexico State and Arkansas. He didn't truly level up until this past fall in Fayetteville.

The 6'1, 223-pounder ripped off 6.4 yards per rush and set career highs in carries (167), yards (1,070), and receptions (28).

He also posted a sturdy 3.86 yards after contact per attempt, per PFF.

Washington shows NFL burst and enough receiving polish to stay on the field in passing situations. That showed up again at the Senior Bowl, where he looked like the most complete back. Then he shredded the Combine.

Given that trajectory, Washington looks increasingly like a Day 2 candidate.

Bernard lacks true top-end speed and converted just 12 of 31 contested targets in college. His draft capital could signal whether there's upside worth chasing.
